THE RINGING OF THE CHIMES

CALL TO WORSHIP & PRAYER

*OPENING HYMN (See pg. 5)

Scholars often ascribe the title, Father of English hymnody to Isaac Watts (1674-1738). Though this title is exceptional, it is not undeserved. Watts was raised in the Independent Congregational Church, part of the dissenters tolerated under the official Church of England (Anglican). From an early age, he showed his dissatisfaction for the established common practice of metrical psalms, the strict poetic versification of the psalms for congregational singing in worship. He pioneered a newer approach by composing hymns that "Christianized" the texts of the Psalter. Even though "Come, we that love the Lord" is not based on a psalm, it still follows Watts' practice of adapting Scripture for use as devotional poetry.

OLD TESTAMENT LESSON

Jonah 3:1-10: The word of the LORD came to Jonah a second time, saying, "Get up, go to Nineveh, that great city, and proclaim to it the message that I tell you." So Jonah set out and went to Nineveh, according to the word of the LORD. Now Nineveh was an exceedingly large city, a three days' walk across. Jonah began to go into the city, going a day's walk. And he cried out, "Forty days more, and Nineveh shall be overthrown!" And the people of Nineveh believed God; they proclaimed a fast, and everyone, great and small, put on sackcloth. When the news reached the king of Nineveh, he rose from his throne, removed his robe, covered himself with sackcloth, and sat in ashes. Then he had a proclamation made in Nineveh: "By the decree of the king and his nobles: No human being or animal, no herd or flock, shall taste anything. They shall not feed, nor shall they drink water. Human beings and animals shall be covered with sackcloth, and they shall cry mightily to God. All shall turn from their evil ways and from the violence that is in their hands. Who knows? God may relent and change his mind; he may turn from his fierce anger, so that we do not perish." When God saw what they did, how they turned from their evil ways, God changed his mind about the calamity that he had said he would bring upon them; and he did not do it.

*HYMN OF RESPONSE (See pg. 7)

I Danced In the Morning when introduced in 1962 captured the spirit of the 1960s protest movement in the United States. It became a sacred equivalent for songs by Pete Seeger in the late 1950s, including Where have all the flower's gone and To everything turn, later made even more popular by Peter, Paul, and Mary, as well as Bob Dylan's Blowin' in the Wind. While the direct and even for some, sacrilegious, language accompanied by the folk acoustic guitar bordered on heresy for some; for others, these songs were a breath of fresh air. I Danced In the Morning brought this sound and spirit into the church, especially in services designed to reach young people. Sydney Carter, the author of the hymn was born in 1915 and was educated at Oxford. He taught high school in the 1940s. Sympathizing with the Quakers, he served in an ambulance unit with the Society of Friends during World War II. Carter began composing songs in the 1950s and 1960s, many of which remain very popular to this day in the schools of Great Britain.
