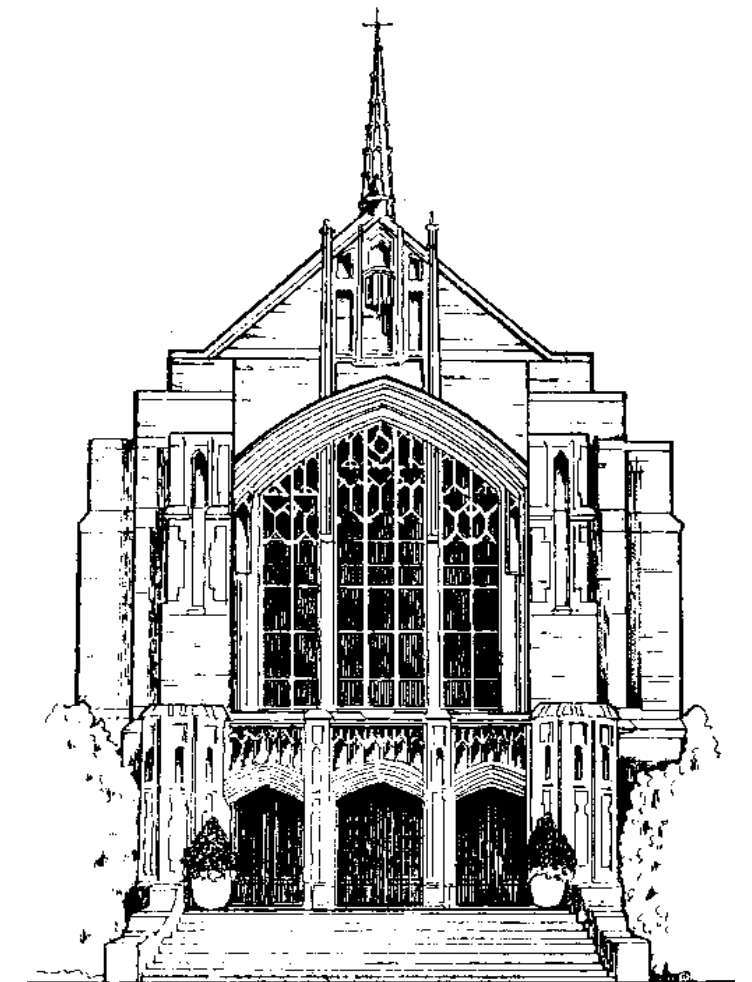

Fred Kaan who provided the text for this familiar tune sought to address
issues of peace and justice. He was born in Harlem in the Netherlands in
July 1929. He was baptized in St. Bavo Cathedral but his family did not
attend church regularly. He lived through the Nazi occupation, saw three
of his grandparents die of starvation, and witnessed his parents' deep
involvement in the resistance movement. They took in a number of
refugees. He became a pacifist and began attending church in his teens.
