In his epistle, James has a lot to say about social justice: "Religion that is pure and undefiled before God, the Father, is this: to visit orphans and widows in their affliction, .... A more pointed passage is this: "Behold, the wages of the laborers who mowed your fields, which you kept back by fraud, are crying out against you, and the cries of the harvesters have reached the ears of the Lord of hosts. You have lived on the earth in luxury and in self-indulgence." This hymn deals with similar ideas, as a prayer that we will live in a just and loving way, and it ends with a reminder that we are made in God's image.

**1 Timothy 2:1-7:** First of all, then, I urge that supplications, prayers, intercessions, and thanksgivings be made for everyone, for kings and all who are in high positions, so that we may lead a guiet and peaceable life in all godliness and dignity. This is right and is acceptable in the sight of God our Savior, who desires everyone to be saved and to come to the knowledge of the truth. For there is one God; there is also one mediator between God and humankind. Christ Jesus. himself human, who gave himself a ransom for all--this was attested at the right time. For this I was appointed a herald and an apostle (I am telling the truth, I am not lying), a teacher of the Gentiles in faith and truth.

Luke 16:1-13: Then Jesus said to the disciples, "There was a rich

man who had a manager, and charges were brought to him that this

man was squandering his property. So he summoned him and said to

him, 'What is this that I hear about you? Give me an accounting of your

management, because you cannot be my manager any longer.' Then

the manager said to himself. What will I do, now that my master is

taking the position away from me? I am not strong enough to dig, and I

am ashamed to beg. I have decided what to do so that, when I am

dismissed as manager, people may welcome me into their homes.' So,


