#418 A Mighty Fortress Is Our God FIN' FFSTE BURG

This powerful hymn is one of the best known by Martin Luther, a prolific hymnodist. Luther wrote the words and composed the melody sometime between 1527 and 1529. It has been translated into English at least seventy times and also into many other languages. The text is based on Psalm 46. The hymn has been called *The Battle Hymn of the Reformation* for the effect it had in increasing the support of the Reformers' cause. This is a hymn close to the hearts of Protestants and Lutherans, a source of assurance in times of duress and persecution. The text is not restricted, however, to times of actual physical battles. In any time of need, when we do battle with the forces of evil, God is our fortress to hide us and protect us, and the Word that endures forever will fight for us.


