In the mid-nineteenth century, Bishop John William Colenso of Natal raised a ruckus in the Catholic Church when he challenged the historicity and authority of many of the Old Testament books. Bishop Gray of Capetown wrote a stirring response of defense, which, in 1866, inspired Samuel Stone, to write this beloved hymn, basing his text on Article 9 of the Apostle's Creed: "The Holy Catholic (Universal) Church; the Communion of Saints; He is the Head of this Body." Now an affirmation of Christ as the foundation of our faith, we sing this hymn with those who have gone before us and with Christians around the world, declaring that beyond any theological differences, cultural divides, and variances in practice, we are all part of the same body, the body of Christ.

How Firm a Foundation is a hymn that for over two centuries has assured believers of the faithfulness of Christ and the certainty of hope. The first verse acts almost as an introduction to the rest of the text, giving us cause to stop and ponder the Word of assurance that God has given us, described in greater detail in the next four verses. Those four verses are in fact paraphrases of Scripture passages: Isaiah 41:10, 43:2, Romans 8:3-39, Hebrews 13:5, and Deuteronomy 31:6. In the words of this hymn then, we carry with us the Word from God, and the call to trust in that Word. But God's Word is expansive and not limited to letters on a page - the fifth verse moves us to a trust in the Word made flesh in Jesus Christ. Thus we are assured by the words we sing, the Word we are given, and the Word made flesh, of the steadfastness of God and His unfailing love.

The Rise of Islam to Charlemagne with Dr. Roy Vice

Sundays at 11:30am | January 8 - 22 1st Floor - Chapel

This series of lectures will begin with Justinian and the Byzantine Empire. A war between the Byzantines and the Persians leaves both empires exhausted. At that moment Islam exploded out of Arabia, capturing Jerusalem and much of the heartland of Christianity. Early in the development of Islam, there was a split between the Sunnis and the Shi'ites (followers of Ali) which still marks Islam to this day. The Muslims were the global middle men and brought much important knowledge to the West such as Arabic numerals. Victories at Constantinople and at Poitiers in 732 by Charles Martel stopped the Muslim advance. Charlemagne was heir to two generations of Carolingians who created an empire that he would expand. He promoted the standard of writing and literacy. He protected the pope in Rome and in 800 was crowned Holy Roman Emperor. He waged a series of wars against the pagan Saxons to bring them under his control and to force them to accept Christianity.
