*PROCESSIONAL HYMN

As we sing this hymn, perhaps it is helpful to remind ourselves of the events that shaped the "hour" and the "days" that provide the context for this great hymn. "God of grace and God of glory" was written during the Great Depression and between the two World Wars. The author was a champion of the social gospel, a movement that recognized the plight of the poor, especially in the urban Northeast during the Industrial Revolution.

*HYMN OF RESPONSE #267 Blest Be the Tie

This hymn begins by stating that the body of Christ is bound together by love. The second and third stanzas of this hymn elaborate on the idea of suffering and rejoicing together, and the hymn concludes with the hope that this unity will not be permanently broken by death or parting. These themes are found in a lengthy passage in one of Paul's letters. He closed a short section on the unity and diversity of the body of Christ with this thought: "If one member suffers, all suffer together; if one member is honored, all rejoice together. Now you are the body of Christ and individually members of it." A few verses later, he began the great chapter on love, which is the 1st Corinthians Chapter 13.

ADULT SUNDAY SCHOOL

"From Charlemagne to the Church in the High Middle Ages"

Sundays at 11:30am-12:15pm / April 16-30, 2023 1st Floor Chapel

Led by Dr. Roy Vice, this three-session series begins with the decline of Charlemagne's empire. After his death his grandsons would divide his territory into France, the Low countries, and Germany. The Vikings, Saracens, and Magyars raided much of western Europe. Some Vikings or Normans converted to Christianity and settled in Normandy. Alfred the Great fought heroically against the Vikings. In 1066, William Duke of Normandy won the battle of Hastings and conquered all of England. After the year 1000, Europe began a period of economic expansion. This contributed to the growth and prosperity of the Church with new religious orders such as Cluny, Cistercians, and Franciscans.

Adult Sunday School – May 2023 Faith & Story

In years past we have had classes on Faith & Film, using the storytelling that takes place in everyday movies to evoke conversations about matters of life and faith. During the month of May, I would like to try something a little different, and invite us to just listen to stories that have been shared through podcasts/radio such as the Moth Radio Hour that also relate to life and faith. We will listen to some select stories in our class time and then follow up with reflections and discussion. The hope is that in listening to these stories together we will discover points of empathy and be inspired to tell our own stories. On their website, THE MOTH says it "celebrates the ability of stories to honor both the diversity and commonality of human experience, and to satisfy a vital human need for connection." This kind of community building is important in the life of faith as well, and I hope you'll take this opportunity for us to connect and grow together.
