Hazy Days of Summer

Recently I've taken to monitoring the Air Quality Index (AQI) on my I-phone's weather app. Smoke drifting down from uncontrolled Canadian wildfires has frequently darkened our skies this summer, creating an unpleasant haze somewhere between the color of rust and mustard. I have some allergies, and have noticed my eyes burning more than I might expect while outdoors on certain days. Fortunately it has been basically tolerable, though there are warnings that those who have respiratory problems might experience difficulties on the worst of these days. I heard one meteorologist describe the amount of particulates we are breathing in as being roughly the equivalent of smoking cigarettes.

I don't like haze, and much prefer clarity. Some years ago I was hiking up a small mountain where there was reported to be a fine view of the area. By the time I reached the summit, a fog had gathered that made it impossible to see much past the trail I had just ascended. I remember feeling that it was a kind of metaphor for a situation in my life at that moment, where I was unsure of what to do, which direction to take. I would like to know such things, not merely to fly by instruments.

But as the Scriptures put it in 2 Corinthians 5:7, "We walk by faith, not by sight." For our spirituality as Christians, the instruments by which we fly are our theology—composed of a combination of our understanding of Scripture, Christian traditions, and experiences through which God has led us.

We believe, and we seek guidance, but faith requires us to walk forward even when the sight lines are elusive. Earlier in that passage, it is discussing the trials the apostle and the early Christians were enduring, and Paul says in 2 Cor 4:17-18: "This slight momentary affliction is preparing us for an eternal weight of glory beyond all measure, because we look not at what can be seen but at what cannot be seen; for what can be seen is temporary, but what cannot be seen is eternal."

On cloudy days I've sometimes had to remind myself that the sun is still shining. The sunshine is there in all its glory beyond the clouds, and those clouds have simply obscured our view. Time will pass and the clouds will move on, we shall see the sun again, as sure as the earth is turning. And we even need the rain as part of the water cycle and the circle of life.

I'm not sure how much we need the smoke and the haze it brings. Yet nature's fires also have a way of cleansing the natural order, preparing the forests and soils for new growth. Our human discomfort in the midst of nature's forces is a reminder of how small we are compared to the great patterns of the weather. And it's also a reminder of how much we humans seek to dominate it and perhaps even foul it up with our part in the negative impacts of a changing climate.

Monthly Grief Support Group


Summer Schedule Third Sunday: August 20 11:30 – 12:15 First Baptist Church
