A Life of Service to God

Recently in church I spoke of my uncle, Rev. John Moes, who passed away at the age of 102. He was very sharp even in advanced years, even preaching a sermon in a church on his 100th birthday. He had a bit of what Deuteronomy 34:7 says of Moses, that "his eye was not dim, nor his strength abated." Well, he was indeed growing frail, yet he shared love and joy with his family to the end.


As I watched his funeral via livestream as family memories paid tribute, I remembered many of my own experiences with him and my aunt, Elaine. I recall visiting their Christian Seamen's Center in Seattle where they led a fruitful ministry for sailors who brought the big container ships into port. Those Asian workers found a home away from home with John and Elaine, whom they referred to as Mom and Dad. John would lead Bible studies with them, encourage them in their family lives, and share the gospel however he could.

In his younger days John had been a pastor in Iowa, planting a church in the city of Waterloo. One of his attendees was a young nurse in training at a local hospital. When Elaine's brother came for a visit, she played matchmaker and the two young people fell in love. Those were my parents, and that's how my Minnesota father found his way to marrying an Iowa farmer's daughter and I got to grow up where I did.

My grandmother's family had homesteaded in the dry soil of Conrad, Montana when she was just a child, though the family returned to Minnesota when the land gave out. As the turns of life would have it, John and Elaine (Elaine was her daughter) ended up going out to that town for John to be pastor of the church my grandmother attended as a child.



My parents had brought me there in a pickup camper when I was a child during that era, and we retrieved a large stone from the abandoned homestead and took it back to my grandmother in Minnesota. In 2019 when I visited Glacier Park I stopped in Conrad and visited John's church, meeting a best friend of his daughter and paging through church history items to see bits of family heritage still evident there.

These brief recollections encourage me to be faithful in life and ministry even as my Uncle John and Aunt Elaine were. And here in Dayton we have a similar legacy in our own centenarian minister, Jim Ernest, who has blessed many of our lives along the way. Could I still have over 4 decades of life and ministry ahead? It seems hard to fathom, but these saints have made it so. *(continued next page)*



Exploring Church History

Led by Dr. Roy Vice Sundays @ 11:30am-12:15pm January 7-28, 2024 1st Floor – Chapel

This series of lecture will focus on the era between 1100 and 1300. It will cover St. Bernard of Clairvaux and the Cistercians and then move on to St. Francis of Assisi and St. Antony of Padua, the patron saint of lost things. The Dominicans focused on combatting heresy and intellectual study. St. Thomas Aquinas and St. Albertus Magnus were two Dominicans who helped to create Scholasticism, which combined the thought of Aristotle with Christian Theology. This era also saw the rise of the first universities and a huge growth of cities. Finally, Europe expanded in the Reconquista in Spain and the Crusades in the Middle East. The legacy of this conflict between Christians and Muslims is still with us today.




The Rev. Jim Earnest Receives a Quilt of Valor


