# Anglican Evensongs

As anticipated last month, Angie and I made our trip to England and Wales. We managed to get our big suitcase checked at the airport at 49.5 pounds, narrowly avoiding a surcharge. I did ok health-wise despite nursing a sore and swollen leg, but was not to be deterred from enjoying the time. We watched several of Jenna's basketball games, meeting her teammates and soaking in Cardiff's university sport culture. In the midst of it all I found my spirituality nurtured in some significant ways.

One of my requests for the trip was to visit Oxford, England for my birthday. Regents Park University, affiliated with the British Baptist Union, has their own little slice of academia there. I previously heard Dr. Paul Fiddes through the Baptist World Alliance meetings. He is perhaps the foremost living Baptist theologian and the retired Principal there. He invited us to have lunch at the school, so we found their quadrangle and met him there. When the dinner bell rang, students and "fellows" of the school gathered around wooden tables and we enjoyed "sausage and mash" (ed potatoes). Paul apologized for the simple fare, but I relished the fact that we got to experience just what a student might. Their college holds one of the best archives of Baptist history, and scholars from around the world come to visit (perhaps an idea for a sabbatical someday!).

In Oxford we were encouraged to attend an Evensong at a college chapel, so we put that on the agenda. In contrast to the simplicity of our Baptist college there, we saw in New College Chapel the lavish and ornate historical architecture for which Oxford is famous—and the kind of sites where Harry Potter's Hogwarts scenes were filmed. The Evensong tradition is the nightly service written into the old Book of Common Prayer.

In select places the prayers and biblical texts are sung or chanted by a choir or cantors. Oxford still has a few "singing colleges" where Evensong is practiced—though it was once almost universal there. These days a handful of people gather in magnificent candlelit sanctuaries to listen to the beautiful and quiet tones of prayer eloquently presented by talented musicians and leaders.

After New Chapel I made my way to Magdalen College, familiar as the school where C. S. Lewis taught literature. It started at 9:00 pm, and jet lag being a thing, Angie took a break. I sat by a man from Denmark and we struck up conversation. James was visiting with the intention of going to J. R. R. Tolkien's grave the next day, so we were kindred spirits.

After the lovely "Shrove Tuesday" service, we were offered lemon crepes in a fellowship room afterward. It was quite a time of reflection on the unity of so many people through the ages, famous to ordinary—and I felt myself somehow very included.

Llandaff Cathedral is the seat of Anglicanism in Cardiff, Wales, and we took in yet one more Evensong there. The sanctuary is surrounded by crypts and sarcophagi of saints and bishops. We think our hall of pastor portraits goes back a ways at 200 years-they have a list of bishops going back to the 800's AD! We saw graffiti on some of the tombs carved with knives with the date 1629, when Cromwell's army took over the cathedral in the British Civil War and defaced some of the statuary. The cathedral had rebuilt its roof and replaced its stained glass with plain after it was bombed in WW II. And in the midst of the historical a living congregation worships and works there today. Signs reminded us that \$1500 per day of donations is required to keep the cathedral afloat—a budget not so far afield from our own. A boys choir (augmented with a handful of adults), the kind you hear on British broadcasts for special occasions, led Llandaff's Evensong service. As the voices soared in a climactic "Amen," I found my eyes tearing up with the powerful beauty of the moment.

As I contemplate some of what I gained there, I am mindful of the beauty of ending a day in prayer and worship. To reflect on what has been done and left undone, to turn over oneself to God before retiring for the night, is a blessed thing indeed. One can't but help feel a sense of completion, and in the morning a sense of fresh start again. The psalmist says he calls out to God "evening, morning and at noon," "and God will hear my voice" (Psalm 55:17). May we cultivate regular habits of worship and reflection that speak to God and listen for the voice of God as well.





BYC is a progressive, youth-centered camp organized each year by a group of Alliance of Baptist and UCC affiliated churches from Ohio, North Carolina, Louisiana, and Tennessee. 
# FBC & Dayton Pride 2024 The Strength of the Gem






