# Steadfast and Joyful

In May of 1824, the virtually deaf composer Ludwig van Beethoven premiered his Ninth (and final) Symphony in Vienna less than three years before his death. Although he shared the stage as honorary director, the musicians of necessity watched the baton of their actual director, who could actually hear and respond to the music. The composition concluded with the powerful movement known as "Ode to Joy," and when finished the hall erupted with a series of five standing ovations. The patrons waved their hands and handkerchiefs in the air so Beethoven could see their applause.

An ocean and continent away, that same month a small band of Baptist believers finalized their plans for the creation of a church. In the frontier Ohio town of Dayton they were meeting regularly at the inn that was the home of William and Lydia Huffman, an establishment that our history book says became known as the "Baptist tavern." On Saturday, May 29<sup>th</sup> a council gathered to examine the 8 hopeful members who wished to begin official work as a duly recognized church. Since there were 9 ministers present, there were 9 sermons that weekend! A Sunday service was held at the courthouse, after which the newly minted congregation walked down Main Street to the Great Miami River, where Lydia Huffman was baptized as the first new member.

Vienna and Dayton couldn't have been much further apart at that time. One was a storied capital of historic Europe, an epicenter of culture. The other was a small outpost in a new state of an emerging country with its fresh hopes and dreams. The established churches of European ancestry looked down upon Baptists as dissenters and upstarts, and the Baptists generally returned the favor by viewing the major denominations as having grown spiritually cold and irrelevant. The early Baptists didn't even countenance music in their worship until some years later when a few brave souls rose to their feet in song, and turned the tide in favor of a sung future.

Dayton has come a long way in 200 years, and so has our congregation. From primitive beginnings we grew into a progressive center of our city's worshipping community. We built one of our denomination's more remarkable houses of worship, a kind of Baptist cathedral. Our congregation has endured the shifting tides of the culture of our own city, mirroring its industrial growth as well as its later decentralization.

We don't often refer to it these days, but a phrase stands out in our church's official covenant. It says that "we shall strive to be steadfast and joyful Christians." We have declared ourselves to be a people who believe God's word continues to unfold. To be steadfast means to hold tenaciously to our faith through the challenges of the times. To be joyful means that God's Spirit enables us to sing through it all!

And so in our bicentennial month we adopt as a theme that great hymn derived from Beethoven's Ninth, "Joyful, Joyful, We Adore Thee." At the conclusion of our May 12<sup>th</sup> service we will unveil an Ohio Historical Marker that speaks to the ways our congregation has been steadfast through two centuries in Dayton. And on May 26<sup>th</sup> we will joyfully celebrate our Founders Day, a memorial that even precedes that weekend's national holiday.

We may well wonder what our future holds—it may be as different as our present is from our origins. Yet our future can remain connected to our roots if we strive to be steadfast. And our future can be bright as if we strive to be joyful! May God's unfolding word continue to fill us with the light of day, and may our hearts unfold like spring flowers before our jubilant God.



### Garden Report

#### Great Is Thy Faithfulness

The second verse of this great hymn pretty much sums up the last few weeks: 'Summer and winter, spring-time and harvest, sun, moon and stars in their courses above join with all nature in manifold witness to Thy great faithfulness, mercy and love.' Typical weather in Ohio meant for a balmy Good Friday as Charlene Bayless and I prepped the Love Your Neighbor Garden for the spring planting by pulling winter weeds. However, snow and freezing temps pushed off our planting day until April 12, still a good day by the almanac. By that time we had witnessed the sun and moon in a choreographed dance to bring darkness upon the earth. In the midst of the day the stars and planets Venus and Jupiter were revealed briefly.

Warmer temps and full sun made a great day for the planting (and harvesting) crew. Julia Wolfe, Lucas and DeAnn Owens, and Ted Greenwood were on hand to plant onions, garlic and potatoes. Even though they were newcomers to the planting process, Pastor Dave now certifies them as Spring Garden Planters and Weeders. The kale survived the mild winter and has been flourishing the past couple of weeks. We were able to harvest about 8-10 pounds of fresh kale leaves to deliver to the House of Bread. Operating in the test kitchen, Carolyn Mowry made a quiche out of the fresh chopped kale and certified it as delicious enough to consume. Next time, I want to be a taste tester!

Thanks to all for your help. Hope to see more of you on May 11 at 10:30 for the planting of the summer garden. We plant, God grows!

## Kale Quiche (Crustless) By Carolyn Mowry

[9-inch pie plate, 350-degrees for about 40 min]

Add 3 C. chopped kale in greased pie plate Add 4 oz grated cheddar

Fry & dice 2 strips bacon, add some onion as bacon finishes (pat on paper towel to absorb grease), then add to pie plate.

For liquid mixture beat 4 small eggs with 1 C Bisquick and 2 C milk. Pour liquid over the ingredients in the pie plate. Make sure all the kale is tucked down under the liquid. Bake and enjoy!





The Rev. JAMES WILLIAM EARNEST born in Springfield, Ohio on August 10, 1922, and passed away on February 17, 2024 at the age of 101. He was preceded in death by his parents, James Merde (d. 1958) and Pearle Elizabeth (McKeag-d. 1972), sister, Lois Carson (d. 1988), wife, Glana Naomi (Hammer-d. 2008), daughter, Dorothy Alice (d. 1999), and son, William Paul (d. 2023). He is survived by son, James Neil (Margaret Ann), and son, Timothy Carl (Kim-d. 2023), nine grandchildren, and fourteen great grandchildren.

He was a graduate of Stivers High School, Rio Grande College, Otterbein College (where he met his wife), Wright State University, Sinclair College. He received his ministerial education at Southern Seminary in Louisville, KY and United Theological Seminary in Dayton, OH.

He was always a bi-vocational minister, wearing many hats for the Lord throughout the years—airplane mechanic, bus/truck driver, furniture mover, toolmaker, machinist, director, coordinator with Model Cities (one of three to rebuild Xenia from 1974 tornado). Serving in the South Pacific in World War II with the Army Air Corp,

Jim worked on airplanes and salvage missions, but also sought to share the Gospel with others there as part of the GI Gospel Hour. And back home he worked in the shop at NCR while serving in ministry in various capacities.

Rev. Earnest started his ministry at the support and promotion of Dr. H.S. Gessner at Franklin First Baptist in Franklin, OH. First licensed in 1947, he served, pastored, taught and counseled for eight decades in a variety of settings, including the Billy Graham Crusades, World Wide Pictures, interim pastorates, pulpit supply, and Camp Director for Camp Kirkwood in Wilmington, OH. His greatest joy was visitations to uplift and cheer others, leaving them feeling not alone and smiling before the sun set. He last served in this capacity from 2008-2014 as part of the Pastoral Staff at the First Baptist Church of Dayton.

With connections to First Baptist Springfield where he was baptized at a young age, as well as Linden Avenue Baptist, Memorial Baptist, and First Baptist Church of Dayton, many in the Dayton Area Baptist Association and region have been blessed by Jim's ministry. As his son, Neil, put it, he "leaves a world of friends, colleagues." Having persevered through many of the world's woes like the Great Depression, WWII, and civil unrests for race, creeds, faiths, beliefs, social changes, ideological misguidances, we give thanks for the Rev. James W. Earnest, a most honest and faithful servant of God. May he rest in peace.

There will be a Celebration of Life for Rev. Earnest on Saturday, May 18 at 10am at the First Baptist Church of Dayton (111 W. Monument Ave, Dayton, OH 45402). All are invited to attend and share in table fellowship as we sing, pray, and share memories of Jim.
