


Special Advent Series!

On Thursday, October 3, 2024, our beloved Dr. Thomas J. Lasley, II received the 2024 Citizen Legion of Honor Award from The Presidents Club of Dayton. We join in celebrating Tom's work and service to those in our community and beyond. Below is an excerpt from the press release from The Presidents Club regarding the award. "The Presidents Club of Dayton is pleased to announce that Thomas J. Lasley, II Ph.D will be the 73rd recipient of the region's 2024 Citizen Legion of Honor Award. The award, given annually since 1951 (2020 COVID exception) is the oldest, most continuous and prestigious recognition of volunteer servant leadership in the Dayton region.

Dr. Lasley is Professor and Dean Emeritus at the University of Dayton School of Education and Health Services. Dr. Lasley received his bachelors, masters, and doctoral degrees at The Ohio State University. He currently serves as the Director, Policy and Advocacy for The Montgomery County Educational Services Center and Learn to Earn Dayton.

He founded or co-founded a number of organizations that are critical to the educational and social programming that is available for young people and adults in the Dayton region, as well as across Ohio. These include Dayton Early College Academy, the Ohio Early College Association, Air Camp, Inc, and others. He was the founder of our community's Learn to Earn Dayton.

Our recipient has served on a wide variety of local, state, and national boards over the past 30 years, including the Dayton Literary Peace Prize; Dayton Metro Library Foundation; National Council on Teacher Quality; National Museum of the United States Air Force Foundation; Chaminade Julienne High School; Boonshoft Museum of Discovery; Air Camp, Inc; and the Special Wish Foundation.

Dr. Lasley is the recipient of numerous honors including the University of Dayton Alumni Award in Scholarship; the National Conference for Community and Justice's Humanitarian Award; the UD's Lackner Award; Knowledge Works' Visionary Leader Award; the Buckeye Association of School Administrators' Jerry Klenke Distinguished Service Award and StriveTogether's Cradle-to-Career Champion Award."
