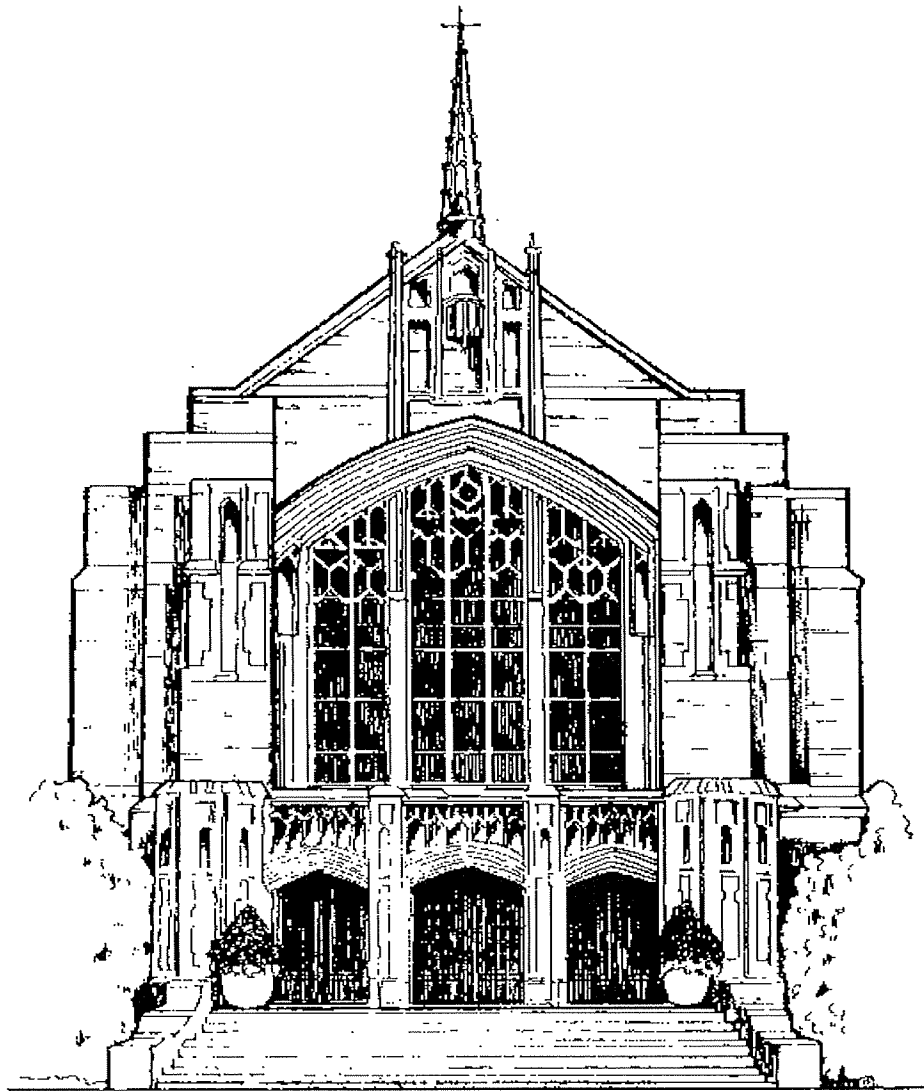

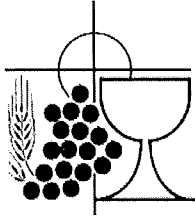

*GOSPEL LESSON: Matthew 9:9-26

Leader: The Gospel of the Lord according to Matthew.

People: Praise to you, Lord Christ!

As Jesus was walking along, he saw a man called Matthew sitting at the tax-collection station, and he said to him, "Follow me." And he got up and followed him. And as he sat at dinner in the house, many tax collectors and sinners came and were sitting with Jesus and his disciples. When the Pharisees saw this, they said to his disciples, "Why does your teacher eat with tax collectors and sinners?" But when he heard this, he said, "Those who are well have no need of a physician, but those who are sick. Go and learn what this means, 'I desire mercy, not sacrifice.' For I have not come to call the righteous but sinners."

Then the disciples of John came to him, saying, "Why do we and the Pharisees fast often, but your disciples do not fast?" And Jesus said to them, "The wedding attendants cannot mourn as long as the bridegroom is with them, can they? The days will come when the bridegroom is taken away from them, and then they will fast. No one sews a piece of unshrunk cloth on an old cloak, for the patch pulls away from the cloak, and a worse tear is made. Neither is new wine put into old wineskins; otherwise, the skins burst, and the wine is spilled, and the skins are ruined, but new wine is put into fresh wineskins, and so both are preserved."

While he was saying these things to them, suddenly a leader came in and knelt before him, saying, "My daughter has just died, but come and lay your hand on her, and she will live." And Jesus got up and followed him, with his disciples. Then suddenly a woman who had been suffering from a flow of blood for twelve years came up behind him and touched the fringe of his cloak, for she was saying to herself, "If I only touch his cloak, I will be made well." Jesus turned, and seeing her he said, "Take heart, daughter; your faith has made you well." And the

woman was made well from that moment. When Jesus came to the leader's house and saw the flute players and the crowd making a commotion, he said, "Go away, for the girl is not dead but sleeping." And they laughed at him. But when the crowd had been put outside, he went in and took her by the hand, and the girl got up. And the report of this spread through all of that district.

*FELLOWSHIP HYMN

#590 *The Solid Rock*
SOLID ROCK

As Edward Mote was walking to work one day in 1834, the thought popped into his head to write a hymn on the "Gracious Experience of a Christian." As he walked up the road, he had the chorus, "On Christ, the solid Rock, I stand; All other ground is sinking sand." By the end of the day, he had the first four verses written out and safely tucked away in his pocket. Later that week, he visited his friend whose wife was very ill, and as they couldn't find a hymnal to sing from, he dug up his newly written verses and sang those with the couple. The wife enjoyed them so much she asked for a copy, and Mote went home to finish the last two verses and sent it off to a publisher, saying, "As these verses so met the dying woman's case, my attention to them was the more arrested, and I had a thousand printed for distribution" (*Lutheran Hymnal Handbook*). Almost two centuries later, we continue to sing these words of hope and assurance, our declaration that in the midst of all trials and storms, we will cling to the rock that is our Savior.

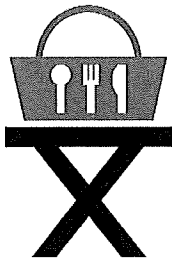
Halleluiah! The Heritage Committee is proud to announce that the updated church history is completed and published. The Book *Steadfast and Joyful: First Baptist Church of Dayton, 1824-2024* represents several years of work by members of the committee and contributions from many church members.

For two centuries, First Baptist Church of Dayton has stood as a cornerstone of faith, resilience, and community life. Steadfast and Joyful traces the church's journey from its founding in 1824 through generations of growth, challenge, and renewal. Through archival records, photographs, and personal narratives, this volume captures the enduring spirit of a congregation rooted in service and hope.

Two options to get a copy of the book:

1. You can download a PDF of the book from Wright State University's Core Scholar "Steadfast and Joyful: First Baptist Church of Dayton, 1824-2024" by Donna Miles Curry. (<https://corescholar.libraries.wright.edu/books/276/>) Eventually we will have a link there where you order a hardcopy of the book.
2. **For now we are taking prepaid orders for hard copies of the book.** We will have a table in the Fellowship hall where you can view the book and place an order. Orders can also be placed in the office, or you can send your order & payment by check to the church—including your preference of paperback or hardback. **Cutoff for these orders is June 14.** Expected delivery will be about 2 weeks later and you can pick up your copy at the church.

Cost of the paperback version is \$20 and the hardback is \$80. After June 14 individuals will be able to order the paperback version from a link on the Core Scholar site, but costs will be higher to cover tax and shipping costs.

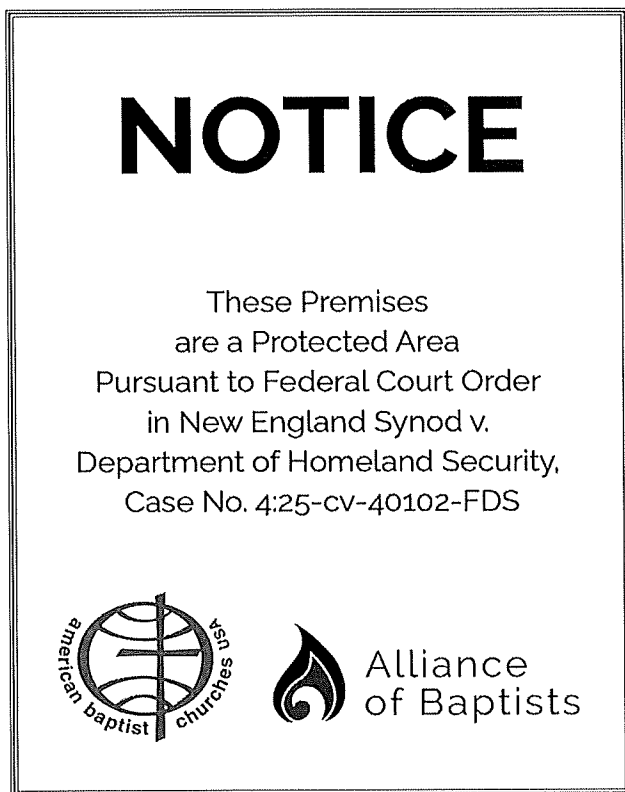

A Word About Protected Area Notices

At our most recent Executive Council meeting, I shared the news that the Alliance of Baptists and ABCUSA had joined other churches and denominations in legal action following the removal of long-standing protections for sensitive locations such as houses of worship. Presently, a federal court has issued a preliminary injunction restricting U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE) from conducting enforcement actions inside churches and within 100 feet of church property, including parking lots, or from targeting individuals traveling to worship. The attorneys representing the Alliance and other groups in the case are working to get the decision moved from a preliminary injunction to a summary judgment, a more permanent status for the protections.



Congregations have been encouraged to consider displaying their denominational logo(s) along with a reference to the court case at points of entry, not only as a deterrent, but also as a sign of connection and shared witness. Hearing this, the Executive Council unanimously decided that we should put up such notices on our entryways. On the table by the church office is an FAQ informational sheet related to the injunction, and we will try to provide more education on this in the near future. In the meantime, let us continue to pray for wisdom, courage, and faithfulness as we seek to remain places of refuge, worship, and hope.

**Note: I've borrowed some language here from a few denominational statements for the sake of brevity and clarity.*

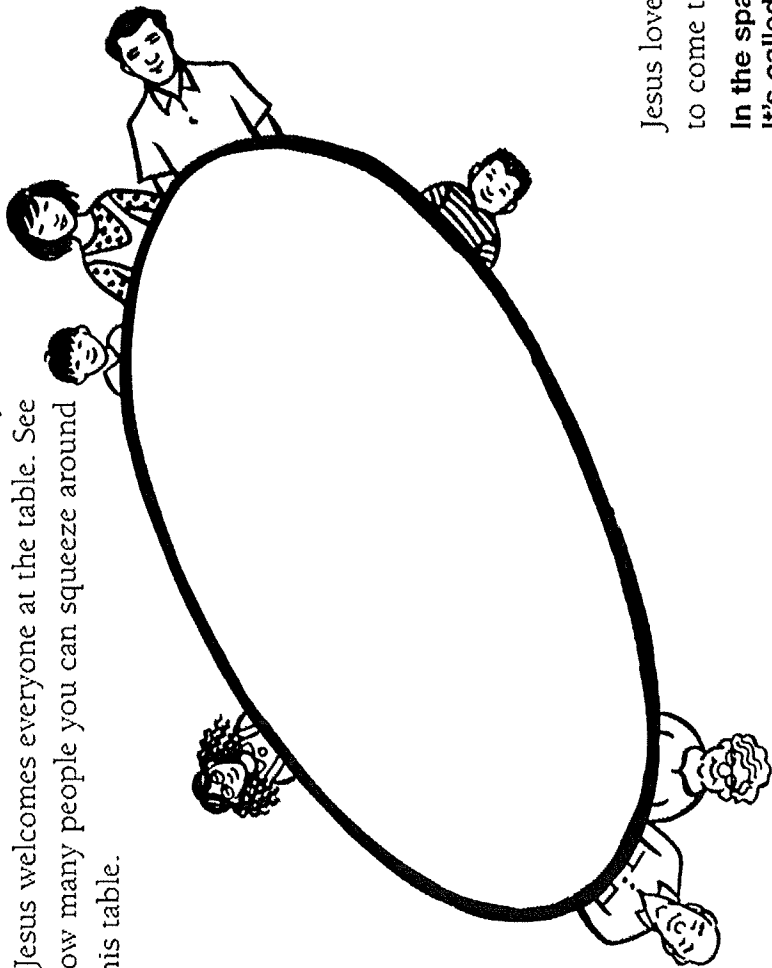
Head room at God's table

Matthew 9:9-13, 18-26

Jesus loved everyone. This made some people mad. They thought some people were better than others. But everybody does things they shouldn't do sometimes. These are called sins.
